Practice

- School consistency
- Every family should have an advocate
- Families are valued (share this philosophy across system)
- Achieve intended outcomes
- Measuring results
- Prioritization for early intervention
- Get family therapy into homes
- Specific discharge identified at placement/intake
- Standardized assessments
- Social determinants of health

Policy (outside of DHS)

- School consistency
- Judicial policies and rulings
- Stop getting in the way of flexibility across departments
- Medicaid should incentivize outcomes
- Build preventative policies
- Validation to families (strengths based)
- Wraparound services for all areas (develop resource guide)
- Definition of safety, especially in move toward community based care
- Standardized assessments
- Alignment with law enforcement/justice systems
- Wide range of providers/systems in new broader child welfare system

Regulatory

- School consistency
- Mediation in court system
- Savings reinvested in system by geographic area
- Many agencies involved in child welfare system
- Get family therapy into homes
- Differences between JJ/CWS families
- Standardized assessments



Fiscal

- Current funding based on formal court processes
- Innovation driven by funding alternatives
- Savings reinvested in system by geographic area

- Prevention services controlled at local level
